## **Middle School Faith Formation Information**

- Club 3:16: After school, starting at 3:16 we will have open Gym, a study area, and snacks each Wednesday. In addition, we will have a variety of fun activities like movies and open Youth Room, as well as service opportunities, until 4:15 classes begin. *No registration needed!* Just have your child head straight to St. Mary's to be part of Club 3:16!
- **Curriculum:** All children in the parish grades K-6 are using a program called *Alive in Christ*. This curriculum also has a website, <u>aliveinchrist.osv.com</u>. It has materials and information for youth and parents. Take some time to check it out! Youth in grades 7 & 8 are using *Faith Fusion*, where they will cover the breadth of the Catholic faith over these two years.
- **Small Groups:** Middle schoolers will be in small groups. Each small group is led by a parish adult volunteer. Please do not bring friends to small group sessions; if you do they will need to fill out an emergency contact form. Small groups meet 4:15-5:30 or 6:30-7:45.
- **Service:** Twice during the year, each small group will work on a service project. Evening classes will visit the White Bear Care Center to lead activities with the residents; afternoon classes will do fall clean-up for local seniors. On these days, please arrive <u>15 minutes early</u>. You will be notified by mail. Everyone will participate in our Service Day in January.
- Walking to St. Mary's: If your child is walking over to St. Mary's after school, please talk with them about guidelines for their safety (Ex. Can they stop anywhere on their way?) Please arrive no later than 4:00.
- **Kohler Kafé:** A meal will be served from 5:15-6:15 PM each Wednesday during Faith Formation. Use this as family time before or after classes.

- **Communication:** Communication to middle schoolers and their parents will be through the parish bulletin, emails, letters home and handouts given to the middle schoolers on Wednesdays.
