Social Justice Rationale: "Gun violence is sometimes perpetrated by people struggling with mental illness, depression, or addiction, Minnesota must make a serious commitment to provide health services and support to those who are facing such challenges, as well as to their families and caregivers. (CCC: 2316; CSDC: 511)"
