

Some highlights of the classmates who spent their elementary years at St. Mary's were: recess, Dr. Seuss' story, Sneetches, which they made into a play in 2nd grade, the Non-Public School Marathon and having Ms. Bishop in 5th grade. Also, very popular in the 5th grade was the "Exchange City" project, which was an interactive event whereby students participated in "real life" businesses.

By far, the most memorable experience during these earlier years was the fifth grade trip to Wolf Ridge: Environmental Learning Center (ELC) in Finland, MN. The three days of hands on learning and working together included a challenging ropes course and roleplaying the fur traders and the Ojibwa experience.

As these students moved into their middle school years at St. Mary of the Lake, the sports teams (including, soccer, football, hockey, basketball, baseball and tennis) became an important part of their school and after-school experience, including the very popular Ski Club (especially in 8th grade). A 7th grade highlight for Max was breaking Chad King's ('82) 50 yard dash record with a time of 6.2 seconds and, also, now in 8th grade breaking Aaron Coronna's ('94) quarter mile run with a time of 1.07. [ed. note: Wow, way to go, Max, congratulations!] The yearly trip to Valley Fair was at the top of the "fun" list and pulling buckthorn trees and shrubs at Camp Sacajawea was a great time, too. The middle school musicals (Seussical, Jr. ['08], Music Man, Jr. ['09], and Willy Wonka, Jr. ['10'] provided good theatre and backstage experience for students which Amber especially enjoyed in Music Man as the mayor's wife. Field trips, like going to the Guthrie Theatre in Mpls., also expanded their horizon. The daily study hall and Book Club were mentioned as academically helpful.

The eighth graders mentioned that weekly Mass, St. Mary's Summer B.L.A.S.T. 


Classmates Erica Martin and Annie Cherek McDonald visit after Annie's April 2010 talk on heart health at St. Mary's.

In a June 10, 2010 news release about the Agency's "most extensive and most successful" operation ever targeting Mexican drug cartels, federal authorities on Wednesday [6/7/10] launched raids across the country and arrested more than 400 people... The entire operation, dubbed "Project Deliverance," dealt a "debilitating blow" to a network of people inside the United States who act on behalf of Mexican drug cartels and contribute to the rising violence along the U.S.-Mexican border, DEA Acting Administrator Michele Leonhart said. "[Project] Deliverance continues a deliberate and strategic

effort to cut off and shut down the supply of drugs entering our country, and the flow of drug profits and guns to Mexico," Leonhart said. "The stakes are extraordinarily high, and this massive operation is a milestone in our tireless assault on these violent drug cartels."

Following St. Mary of the Lake School and White Bear High, Michele graduated from Bemidji State College in Minnesota with a bachelor's degree in criminal justice in 1978. She began her law enforcement career by attending the Baltimore Police Academy, after which she served as a patrol officer in the Northwest District of Baltimore. She joined the DEA as a special agent in late 1980. Michele is married with 2 sons. In a recent email Michele wrote, "One of the saddest things about our class was the loss of Cathy Weichman. After spending 9th grade at Archbishop Murray together she died of aplastic anemia after her battle with the disease. I was proud to call her a close friend and fellow team member of the White Bear Lake Trojanettes Drill Team and Color Guard. She was buried wearing her Trojanette uniform."



MIKE MULLANEY '60 1944 - 2009



Friends' Award


Sara and Jim Pederson are the 2010 "Friends of St. Mary's" honorees

"Lunch and Literature"


Book Clubs by Mrs. Terry Nelson, Media Specialist





Class of 1940 Updates (continued)

GERALDINE MICHAUD DOYLE shares two stories in this Newsletter, both personal, both from the heart. The first story is taken from an interview by her grandson, Matt, in March 1999 about her life. These are some of the details she shared with him. "I was born in 1926 weighing 10 lbs. I was the first baby baptized in the newly built St. Mary of the Lake Church. This was prior to the 1929 financial crash but our family was fortunate because my father worked in the office of the Northern Pacific Railroad and they were, generally, able to keep him employed. We lived near the railroad tracks and I remember the "tramps" (homeless people) would knock on our door during the depression (almost like we had an "X" mark on our house that we were ok folks to stop by for help). My Mother always fed them and they were allowed to take a sponge bath and shave at our kitchen sink. I remember Sunday outings, Bloomers Ice Cream cones, lots of swimming in WBL and skating in winter. I attended 8 years at St. Mary's, 2 years of WBL HS and then graduated from Johnson HS. I started working at Schoch's

The High School Band will be in the parade and will play if they don't freeze up..."

2010 ~ The St. Paul Winter Carnival is the nation's oldest and largest winter festival and is held over a ten-day period in late January-early February each year. King Boreas and his Vulcans reign over the fun. The Landmark Center and Rice Park in downtown St. Paul are home to the elaborate ice sculptures created each year. Special events include parades, a winter playground, a giant snow slide, an ice carving contest, a treasure hunt for the special Winter Carnival medallion, and the ice fishing contest on White Bear Lake.

GLORIA REIBEL FUCHS '32 was recently the unfortunate subject of multimedia attention. Around midday on Tuesday, May 11, 2010 she was assaulted and robbed outside her St. Paul home. Gloria (who will be 92 years old in July) had just pulled into her garage after going to the dentist when she saw a man by the door. She thought the man was just trying to make conversation, so she walked towards him. She thought he was a new neighbor, but then he hit her in the face, she fell to her knees, and then he stole her purse and ran. She cried for help but no one came, so she made it back into the house and called 911. St. Paul Police Sgt. Paul Schnell* said they are hoping someone from the public comes forward with more information.

Gloria and her late husband, Jake, built their Midway area home in 1950; she's lived there for 60 years. She said nothing bad has ever happened to her in this neighborhood until that Tuesday afternoon. In spite of the trauma and her badly bruised face, Gloria says she's doing well now, and although she lost quite a bit of money which she had

in her purse to pay her dental bill and has had to replace her driver's license and other cards, she's back to her regular routines, although a bit more cautious. Gloria asked how everything was going at St. Mary of the Lake and is looking forward to the next alumni gathering.

My father, Robert Whitaker '30

written by his son, Larry Whitaker '57



Lawrence Robert "Bob" Whitaker was born on July 24, 1914 to Fredrick and Louise Hardy Whitaker. One of six children, he had an active childhood, working odd jobs and spent as much time on the lake as possible swimming and fishing. He and Tom Beresford would swim across the lake from Clark Ave. to the Wildwood shore. One would swim while the other paddled the canoe, then switch places for the return trip. Dad had a life-long love for hunting and fishing, and always became excited to see wildlife. During the last year of his life, mom and dad moved to senior housing at St. Andrew's in Mahtomedi. He enjoyed watching the deer from their patio doors. Dad struggled in school (today he would be considered dyslexic) and he suffered with migraines. Despite these issues, he always had a positive attitude, and a willingness to help others. He and mother had a large group of friends and would enjoy neighborhood and family gatherings. They played golf and socialized at the Forest Lake Country Club. In fact, the evening after his first grandchild was born was considered legendary! Oh, how he enjoyed his Grandchildren! During the depression, jobs were not available, so he and friends would hop freight trains. They

would camp, or find lodging at a church, or at the local jail. Dad had many stories to tell. One of which was the time he







was sitting in the doorway of a boxcar, legs dangling outside. Suddenly the world "dropped away" as they traveled across the St. Croix River. The ground, which had been about 5 feet below him, had suddenly dropped to 185 feet. He called it a "puckering moment". Dad was dedicated to his family and friends, always willing to help. He worked hard and maintained an easy disposition. He provided well for his family. He was not a strict disciplinarian, but when he had a "heart to heart" with you, you knew what behavior needed correction, you knew why, and you knew what effect that behavior would have on your future. You also knew you were loved. His employment career and civic service included: office clerk at Northern Pacific Rail Road, night cook at 3M, Volunteer Fireman / Rescue Squad member, Safety Inspector - Twin City Arsenal, Electrician's helper, and 20+ years with WBL School District. Dad was also in WWII and the Korean War. Mother (Eileen McDevitt) met Dad in 1934, when she came out to "the country" to visit her sister, Rose. They were married on July 24, 1939. They lost their first child, Robert at birth, Jane ('55) followed a year later, and I came along 18 months later. We lived in eight houses without leaving White Bear. Dad was very handy so he would buy a house, remodel it and move on. In 1953 he built his dream house at 2229 South Shore Blvd. on the lake he loved so much! On Oct. 8, 2001 he slept away after spending a lucid day and evening with family. His sudden passing was a shock to everyone! Religion was a major component of his

childhood. His father Fredrick (b; 1873 at the Leip Hotel - where Kowalski's now sits) converted to Catholicism in order to marry Louise Hardy, a French Canadian immigrant. They were both very involved in the early years of St. Mary's Parish. Dad's Catholic upbringing provided him with a solid moral grounding, not in a dogmatic manner, but in the true spirit of Christ's example. Kind, compassionate, creative, are but a few words I could use to further describe Dad. He certainly set a fine example. Our family has been blessed to have had this man in our lives.

MARGARET DOUGHERTY

(information taken from two articles on the Dougherty Family in the 1997 and 2007 Alumni Newsletters)



Margaret was the second of four sisters who all graduated from St. Mary of the Lake School: Grace '17, Margaret '20, Mary '24 and Anne '27. Margaret's professional life was spent as the executive secretary to the Director of Family Services of St. Paul for over 30 years. She was highly respected and loved for her professional skills and great warmth.

Margaret, Grace and Anne (Mary married and raised a family) lived in the family home which was located near the corner of Lake Avenue and Highway 61. The section of land next to Hwy. 61 became a veritable showcase horticultural extravaganza for all to enjoy. Many school children

(during that era) toured the Dougherty gardens and were treated to a plate of homemade cookies at the end of the tour. The three sisters graciously supplied and cared for the church's altar flowers each week for approximately 50 years.

Anne died in 1974. In 1985 because of their devotion and years of outstanding service to the people of St. Mary of the Lake, Grace and Margaret were specially honored. This honor has become an annual tradition of recognizing extraordinary service to St. Mary of the Lake, and is known as the "Dougherty Award". St. Mary of the Lake was privileged to be the Dougherty sisters' faith community. All the sisters are now deceased, Grace and Mary in 1997, and Margaret in 2002, but their legacy lives on.

SUSAN KIEFFER DECORSEY FRANCIS

(information taken from 2004 Alumni Newsletter)



Susan was born November 9, 1904 to Nicholas and Margaret Kieffer. She was one of 13 children. They grew up on a produce farm in the area of Hwy. 96 and Otter Lake Rd., WBL. Susan and her sisters, Cecelia and Dorothy, began grade school at Washington School and then transferred to the new St. Mary of the Lake School in September 1914. After graduation from St. Mary's, Susan and her friend, Mary Franzen, traveled to St. Paul to seek employment. Susan started work at the Emporium Department Store the very next day and was employed there for 9 years. Susan married John DeCorsey (a prize fighter) in 1925. They had two sons, John and

Ronald. This marriage ended in divorce. In 1937 Susan married William Francis who worked for the railroad and was a musician performing in many local bands. They added Darlene and Robert to the family. Susan worked in the retail business until retiring in 1970. She then volunteered with the lunch program at the Senior Citizen Center which was located at that time in the Presbyterian Church. Susan was baptized and confirmed at St. Mary of the Lake and an open house for her 100th Birthday was held in the St. Joseph's room in October 2004. Susan was 102 years when she passed away on April 27, 2007. A Mass of Christian Burial was at St. Mary of the Lake Church followed by burial at St. Mary's Cemetery

MARGUERITE BAZILLE PARENTEAU

(information taken from an interview by Marilyn Parenteau Sklar '57 with her mother and written for the 2000 Alumni Newsletter)



"Marguerite began her formal education in first grade at Washington School. ... Two years later, in 1914, St. Mary's School was built. Father Fahey went Washington School and invited all the Catholic children to attend the new school-apparently children not of the Catholic faith were also invited! Marguerite walked to and from school each day from her home on Division Avenue. 'Sister Virginia taught us the Irish jig... we danced on the stage for a school program. We studied the Palmer method of handwriting.' (for which she received a special award for good

handwriting). Marguerite received the Class of 1920 'Gold Medal Award' for achieving the highest grade average. Marguerite lived all her life in White Bear Lake. She and her husband, Mitchell, raised four children, Richard '48, John '50, Marilyn '57 and Michael '61." Marguerite died in 2002 at the age of 95 and is buried in St. Mary of the Lake Cemetery.




