

Help Refugees Through the Circle of Welcome

Circle of Welcome connects faith and community groups directly with refugees and other arrivals who have a special status and need help. Volunteers from these groups walk with families, couples, and individuals as friends, supporters, and advocates, and help them become self-sufficient and established in the community more quickly.



HOME SAFE IN MINNESOTA

Refugees and others who have a special status arrive in the United States legally after being forced to flee violence and persecution. Once they arrive in Minnesota, LSS Refugee Services works to secure safe and affordable housing for them. Part of welcoming refugees to their new home is helping them build connections to their community.

That's where the Circle of Welcome comes in, offering transformative, neighborly support for refugees during the challenges of resettlement. The impact of many different neighbors coming together to walk alongside a newly-arrived neighbor is truly life-changing.

BY THE NUMBERS

Many groups have been a part of LSS' Circle of Welcome program since its inception and have a decades-long history of welcoming new neighbors. Over the past year, we've worked with over 30 congregations and community groups. Please consider how your community can get involved.

WHAT DOES IT LOOK LIKE?

Groups are matched with a family, couple, or individual by staff at LSS who schedule and facilitate an initial meeting between the volunteer team and the refugee(s). LSS provides support to the Volunteer Team throughout their time commitment, and will conduct trainings, check-ins, and closing meetings. Faith and community groups of different shapes and sizes are welcome!

LSS provides two models of engagement with our Circle of Welcome program. The partnership between the local resettlement agency, volunteers, and the refugees themselves reinforces the Long Welcome as an essential component to the refugee's successful integration.

- Circle of Welcome Team Program: The more traditional format, a volunteer team pledges monetary support of \$6,000-8,000 as well as inperson support for 6 months for a family arriving in Minnesota. Activities might include setting up an apartment, helping adults find jobs, practicing English and running errands.
- Circle of Welcome Mentor Program: It isn't just families settling in Minnesota! With a varied time commitment and a more flexible monetary commitment, our Mentor Program pairs volunteers with newly arrived refugee individuals or couples. Mentor volunteers perform many of the same tasks and activities as the traditional model.

- Moving Volunteer
