WOMEN'S RETREAT - WISE WOMEN: COMPANIONS FOR OUR DISCIPLESHIP JOURNEY

Description: Ignited through our baptism, discipleship is a lifelong journey of faith. The journey, although enriching, may sometimes be challenging. Having companions on the journey can help us stay committed and strong. During this retreat, we will examine three first-century women who were Jesus' disciples, including the Syrophonician Woman in Mark's gospel, Mary Magdalene and Mary the Mother of Jesus to learn more about their discipleship. These women can be role models and companions for our own faith journey inspiring us with courage and fortitude.
